- 2. **Apologies:** Carole Dell; Richard Currie
- Notification of matters for consideration under Any Other Business: One item on Health & Safety was discussed at this point. The electricians have left a lot of their equipment in the cupboards at the back of church and someone fell because of it. The electricians will clear this before Friday.
- 4. Approval of Minutes of the PCC Meeting held on 20th June 2017: Approved and signed.
- 5. **Matters Arising:** None
- 6. **Standing Committee Reports:** The lease on the Court House cottage has been renewed for another year.

7. Committee/Group Reports

- **Finance Committee:** There was one query about a fall in giving; this is not planned giving but rather one off windfall giving. There would be a rent review of the Court House cottage next year as the three-year term would come to an end.
- Buildings Committee: The lighting scheme is now mostly done; the control system is still to be installed. This will be followed by a period of evaluation, no timetable for this at present. The war graves commission have approached asking to put signage up re the war graves in Rectory lane, there will need to be a resolution for this, but not until November's meeting.
 Stone and lead work: The PCC resolves to proceed with stonework and lead work repairs identified in the QIR (Quinquennial Inspection Report) 2015 together with similar repairs to the roof and stonework of the tower stair turret.
- Cowper Society: Church had/has little knowledge of what is going on with the Cowper society. So it has been decided that they will now report back on activities to the PCC. A list of events has already been sent round. It was agree that this was useful information. The hope is that more of the church would be involved. Next upcoming events are: Nov 23rd Fashion show and Dec 11th Carols with Jeremy Irons.
- 8. **Outreach:** Pru presented a discussion paper regarding outreach. Suggesting possible obstacles to people attending church (sport/ changes in lifestyle/ consumerism etc.) and how we could potentially attract more people (Charity opportunities/ mindfulness etc.). Pru's thoughts on where we are already include: a committee set up for big events; that we have a nominated charity for the year; the website is ticking along with the new logo but needs professional photos taken; possibly emails and communications to be sent out via Mailchimp.

There should be some budget behind this, so we are able to achieve the things we need to. Alan raised that any committee needs to have a grasp of all that is already happening in the church in terms of groups and outreach. Potentially an audit need to be undertaken to this effect

Rector asked everyone to come back next meeting with some ideas and any volunteers to be willing to be on an outreach group.
